AL Numeracy

During AL Numeracy pupils will be completing the Entry Level Mathematics Certification Course. This is accredited by the exam board AQA. This course provides basic and relevant mathematical skills and is suitable for students of all ages. It can build their confidence in maths, especially with lower ability pupils. The assessment is on demand so the students can complete assignments when they are ready, helping to keep them motivated.

There are three levels of entry and for each Level there are eight components.

Component 1: properties of number Component 2: the four operations

Component 3: ratio Component 4: money

Component 5: the calendar and time

Component 6: measures Component 7: geometry Component 8: statistics

AL Literacy

In AL literacy, pupils in Years 7, 8 and 9 are following the AQA 'Step Up' programme. This is accredited by the exam board we use for GCSE language and is designed to consolidate the skills they will need in key stage 4. The programme includes a range of hands on projects including:

Celebrity Fact File

Formal and informal communication Persuasive speaking and writing The World of Work Travel

Each unit is chosen by the teacher to meet the needs of the group. These units may also be supplemented with wider reading activities from carefully chosen fiction texts.

NGRT – we use the New Group Reading Test to identify the reading skills of every student. This online test provides a bespoke breakdown on the strengths and weaknesses of every student. This allows teachers in all subjects to ensure they are supporting students by using a range of reading strategies as appropriate. This further helps staff teaching **Accelerated Learning** to develop targeted and personalised interventions to boost pupil progress.
