
Task

Use your atlas to find the islands illustrated below. Be warned: many of their maps have been turned by a quarter, half or three-quarter turn! Fill in the spaces as follows:

- a In the two spaces above each map, write the island's name and draw an arrow to show the correct direction of north for its map.
- b In the space below each map, write the name of the sea or ocean next to the letter S.
- c For each island, draw a dot to show the location of one of its main cities/ towns and add its name close to your dot.



An example has been provided above. Note that islands 1 to 3 below are in the British Isles; islands 4 to 6 are between southern Europe and north Africa and islands 7 to 9 are from other parts of the world.



Follow-up

- · Using an atlas and your own words, describe the shapes and sizes of any five large British islands.
- Exchange your five island descriptions with those of a fellow student, then try to identify their islands.
- · Discuss how each of your ten island map descriptions could have been improved.
