
MODERN FOREIGN LANGUAGES

As well as learning how to communicate in French and German and learn all our vocabulary and grammar, it is also one of our priorities here in the MFL department to learn about the culture and people in that country. With this in mind during the last few weeks, we have been exploring our links with France and Germany and we have begun our venture into setting up our pen pals with our Year 9 German classes. This is something our pupils have been really excited about and we started by sending Easter cards over to our new German school just before the Easter holidays.

We are exchanging letters with the Sickingen-Gymnasium in Landstuhl, a grammar school in the Kaiserslautern district in southwestern Germany. The town of Landstuhl is steeped in history and culture. It has a population of over 8,000 people and is situated northwest of Stuttgart, an hour away from Heidelberg and not far from the French and Luxembourg borders. It is home to the Sickinger Schloss, a small castle.



The school itself was founded in 1873 and is a wonderful school that offers a huge range of subjects to all the pupils ranging from geography, art, sport, IT to a huge range of languages such as Russian, Spanish, French, English and Latin.




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We began writing our cards and letters just before Easter and we wrote a little bit in English about our own traditions over the holidays. We also wrote some information about ourselves in German. We wrote about our hobbies, our interests, what we do at school and our ambitions for the future. Some of our students also drew some pictures and wrote some little poems for the German pupils to read. We are now eagerly awaiting our returned cards from our German school so that we can return their letters with information about us, our school and our family traditions. We hope over this term to video call the school during our lessons and talk in German to them. We are also planning a video tour of our school for the German pupils and we hope to see their school too. Who knows? One day we may get to visit in person!




Born in Kent and offered an unconditional place at Cambridge University she was also educated at Goldsmiths London and the London School of Economics. Emma had a highly-successful international career in finance. She is a Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA) and worked as a Senior Analyst in London, New York and Hong Kong for HSBC working on an investment portfolio of \$1bn.

Following a life-changing visit to Jakarta, Indonesia, where she was held hostage at gun point, she discovered in herself a yearning to understand the deeper aspects of what it is to be a human being. Emma put her financial career on hold and began travelling, and exploring yoga and meditation. She qualified as a British Wheel of Yoga instructor in 2003 and has since, for over 15 years, taught both yoga and meditation, simultaneously deepening her life-long interest in Buddhism.

A chance meeting with a Buddhist Lama on her first visit to Bhutan in 2011 led to her studying Buddhism with this Lama and, eventually, becoming the first and only Western woman to be ordained in the Himalayan Kingdom of Bhutan as a Buddhist nun.

Continuing with her energetic and entrepreneurial spirit Emma founded the registered UK charity, 'Opening Your Heart to Bhutan' in 2015. This has built medical and educational facilities to help special needs children in Bhutan. In 2017 Emma was given a Points of Light award by the UK Prime Minister in recognition of her exceptional volunteering. Her first book, 'Set Free', was published in April 2017 and details her inspirational story.



Set Free: A Life-Changing Journey from Banking to Buddhism in Bhutan

The Blurb: The man with the gun pushed me down onto the carpet. I tried to cower to make my body curl smaller, instinctively covering my head. 'Oh God, please don't kill me.' My words clung to my teeth and now my whole body was so cold. All I had left were these words. 'Please, Please don't kill me, Jesus, God, Please,' I wanted to live and I knew it with absolute certainty. I don't want to die. Emma Slade was a high-flying debt analyst for a large investment bank, when she was taken hostage in a hotel room on a business trip to Jakarta. She thought she was lucky to come out of it unscathed, but over the ensuing weeks and months, as the financial markets crashed, Emma became her own distressed asset as the trauma following the event took hold. Realising her view on life had profoundly changed she embarked upon a journey, discovering the healing power of yoga and, in Bhutan, opening her eyes to a kinder, more peaceful way of living. From fast-paced City life to the stillness of Bhutan's Himalayan mountains, Set Free is the inspiring true story of Emma's astonishing life lived to extremes and all that that entails: work, travel, spirituality, Buddhism, relationships, and the underlying question of what makes a meaningful life.



Encourage children such as Daniela (12) and Sebastián (5) from Colombia. Like other children, they love drawing and football. They have fond memories of spending Christmas with family and friends. But in other ways, their story is tragically different. Their father was shot dead in his own home. He was a pastor in a dangerous part of the country, and he paid the ultimate price for speaking out against organised crime.

Provide Hajaratu from Nigeria. In 2019, she lost her husband leaving her to care for 5 children alone. While fleeing an attack by in July 2020, she tried to cross a fast-moving river with her young daughter strapped to her back. Hajaratu reached the riverbank to discover she was alone. For Hajaratu, it is yet more unthinkable grief. But she is holding on to Jesus, still praising Him and clinging on to the hope He gives.



<u>RE in the World this Week: Ramadan</u> What is Ramadan? During Ramadan, Muslims fast

from dawn to dusk. It is intended to focus the mind on prayer, spirituality and charity, as well as to purify the body and mind. *How will COVID change Ramadan this year?* With strict curfews and physical distancing to limit the spread of the highly contagious COVID-19 disease, many of Ramadan's rituals and traditions will be curtailed this year. Breaking of the fast is usually a communal affair. It is common for mosques to host large iftars, especially for the poor. 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
