The RE department is looking forward to welcoming 'GSUS Live' to Penwortham Girls' High School on Wednesday 2nd December. Everyone in Year 9 will take part in this amazing opportunity in their form bubbles.

GSUS Live is a mobile education unit which is a multi-media classroom in a lorry trailer. It tells the story of three teenagers facing real-life issues in their lives, and how they get inspiration from the Bible to deal with their problems. Using touch-screen computers, the Year 9 girls will interact with fictional characters through animations, instant chat, short educational films and music videos. They will be exploring the themes of fear, forgiveness and rejection.

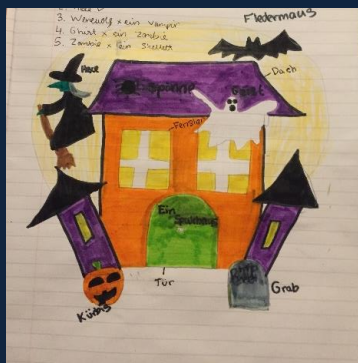

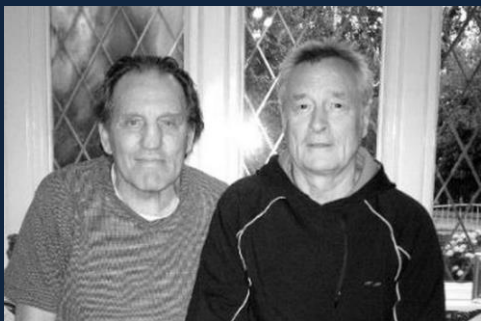
Heartfelt Tributes to Former PGHS Teacher and Boxing Coach

The family of a 'well-loved' amateur boxing coach and former Penwortham Girls' High School teacher have paid tribute following his death.

Andrew Sumner, who lived in New Longton, died on Thursday, November 12, after testing positive for Covid.

Born in Preston, Andrew studied at Preston Grammar School and Manchester University before going on to become a teacher and later becoming Head of Modern Languages at Penwortham Girls' High School from 1970 – 1995, until his retirement.

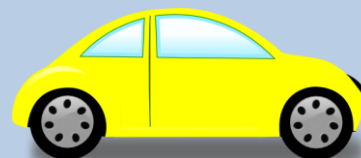


Dear Parents/Carers

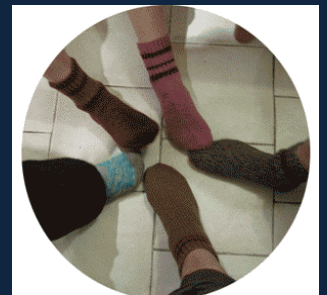
