## NATIONAL ONLINE SAFETY UPDATE

It has been reported that Sexting messages including images and texts have dramatically increased during the pandemic. Data from the safeguarding app **SafeToNet** found that 'sexts' typed out by children in the UK rose 183% during lockdown with a 55% rise in inappropriate messages drafted during normal school hours.

It is our aim here at Penwortham Girls' High School to create resilient and socially responsible users of technology, to do this we need to provide them with all the information they need to not only stay safe online, but also to be able to know what to do if things go wrong. Talking to children about issues and what they do online is key to helping to keep them safe.


