Managing Cover Lessons - Geography


Few people are natural artists! However, Geographers often need to draw sketches. These do not have to be artistic masterpieces. In fact, the quality of the written labels around the sketch is much more important than the quality of the drawing. Buildings are some of the easiest things to sketch because they are simply box-shapes made up of straight lines.



Tasks

This picture shows the centre of a typical village. It has a church, a pub, some houses and a few trees. Under the picture is the start of a sketch of exactly the same view.

- 2 When you think your sketch is as good as you can make it, write at least seven short labels over it to show some of the important things in the village.
- 3 Finish your sketch by adding some colour. If you use too many colours, you will spoil all the good work you have done!
