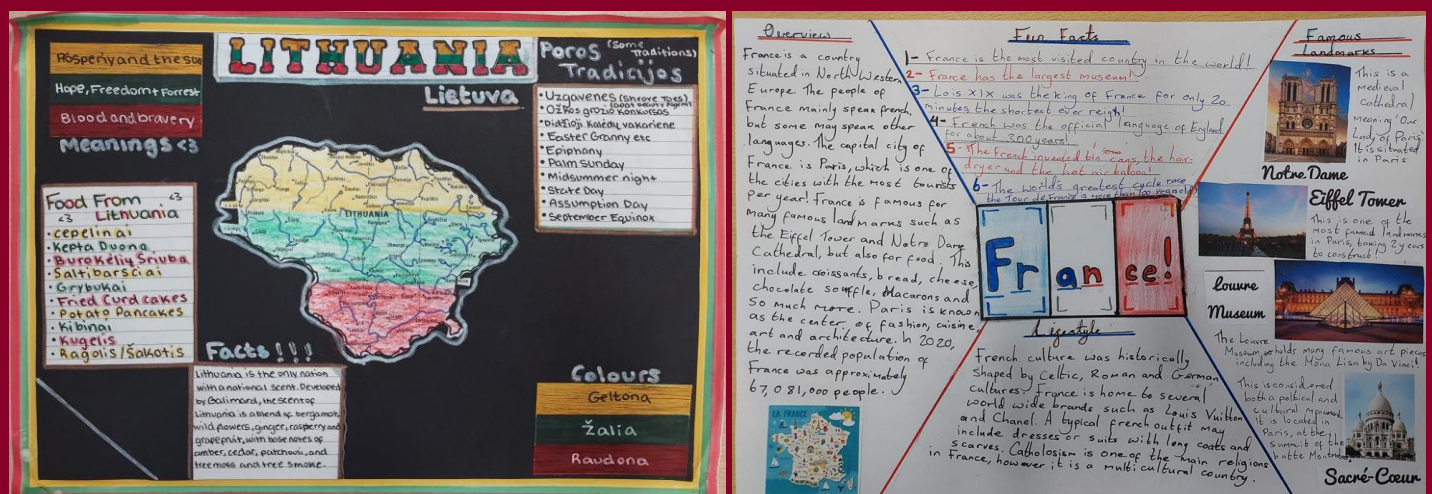

Every year on 26th September, the European Day of Languages is celebrated. It is a day where people in Europe can celebrate all the diverse languages and cultures across the world. It was great to be able to deliver an assembly to all our year groups throughout the week. The highlight of these assemblies were my 6 linguists who all told their audience about our 6 school values in a different language. We had French, German, Urdu, Arabic and Swedish – how amazing was that? The European Day of Languages is a day to celebrate all the languages that we can learn, enjoy listening to and speaking them. This year, we celebrated by greeting our students in a new language and students were able to greet their teacher back in a different language. There were lots of 'Moy Moy' (Finnish), Buenos días (Spanish) and Ahój (Czech) across the school and students also practised these in their MFL lessons. The school staff also wore a badge to represent a country and students were tasked with finding out which country they represented and why. We also had a languages form quiz where forms competed against each other with questions based on different languages and countries. The results will be announced next week and there will be a winner in each year group. Watch this space!

To celebrate European Day of Languages 2021, KS3 have produced some amazing posters which have been entered into our competition. Years 7, 8 and 9 were challenged to choose a country and produce a poster detailing the culture and language of that country. Just 10 minutes a day can make a huge difference to learning and Quizlet makes learning fun. Each week, our classes have vocabulary uploaded and it allows our girls to compete in a tournament to be the quickest at match up but also the most accurate in the quiz. We have also launched our active learn website which gives our students access to reading, listening and vocabulary tasks linked to our schemes of work. 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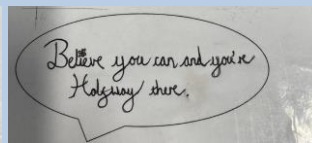
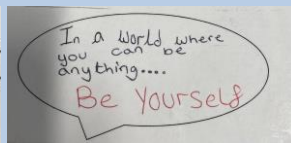


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Life Skills

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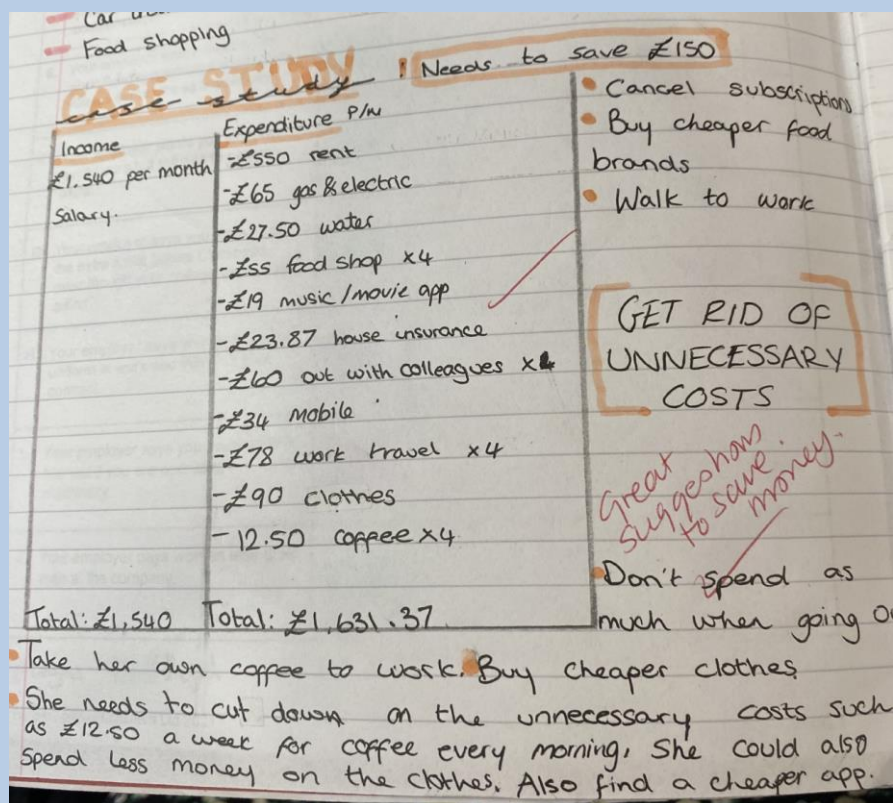
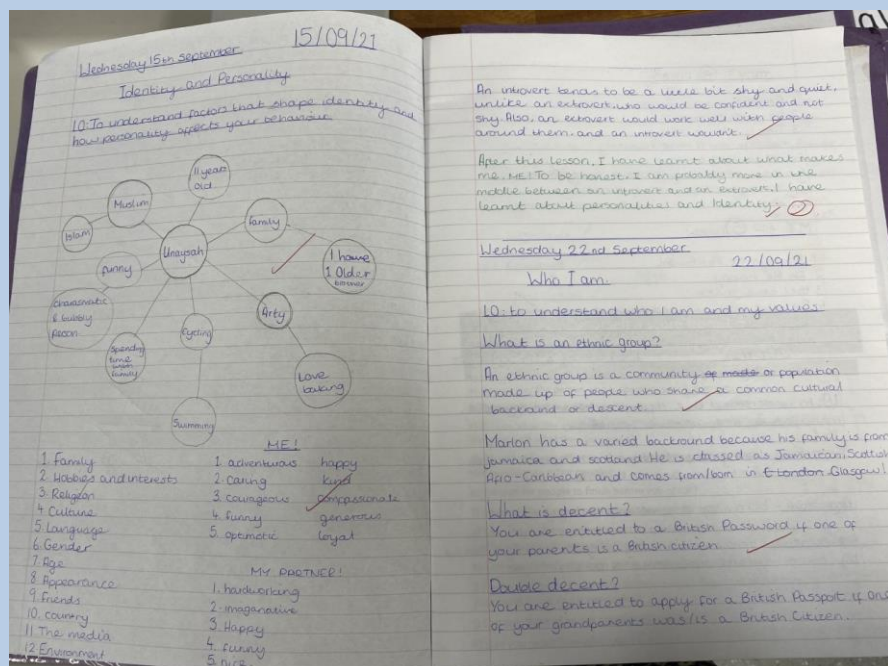


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7RCH recently explored factors that shape your personality and identity. They also looked at ethnic backgrounds and descent. Unaysah P has produced some excellent work on this.

Year 11 students have been looking at finances in order to prepare them for when they become financially dependent. They learnt about tax, national insurance and different types of employment contracts. They practised producing budgets using fixed and variable costs. They are now looking at consumer rights and the ethics of the fashion industry before moving on to advertising. There have been plenty of discussions and reflection. Here is an example of work covered in the budgeting lesson.

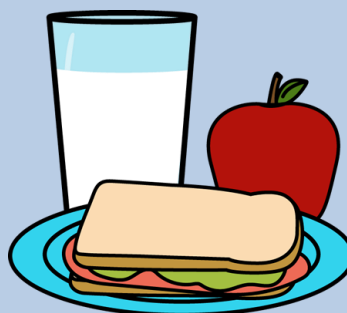
