We know that success in school, whether that is success in sports, music, art or in exams, starts with great attendance. Secure research also shows that school absence can a be major contributor to a number of emotional, health and wellbeing challenges, including low mood and feelings of isolation/loneliness. We also appreciate that Covid temporarily changed the attendance equation, with parents understandably airing on the side of caution when their daughter's felt unwell. However, with now over two-thirds of our school population either vaccinated or Covid-recovered, transmission rates amongst our students are expected to fall. Of course, we will also continue to apply transition control measures, such as mask wearing, for as long as is necessary.

School has been in full Covid-recovery mode since September, with revised schemes of work aimed at tackling any home learning gaps. A new personal development calendar has also been introduced, to ensure our students get to enjoy and benefit from the wider cultural and social aspects of school life, culminating last term with our first 'Literature and Language Festival'. Our GCSE intervention programme is up and running, with a calendar of targeted small group support sessions timetabled to begin post November. Clearly, students are only benefitting from these actions if they are in school.

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

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

3rd prize: Saga G




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

Animal Aid in Year 8

At the heart of everything we do in RS at PGHS, is the enquiry into what it means to be human. The year 8s have started their studies this year with the 'Introduction to Philosophy' unit. Students learn what an 'ultimate question' is, then explore a variety of responses to a series of philosophical questions. The first ultimate question we looked at was 'Are Humans Truly Unique?' which led us to the follow-up question of 'Are Humans Superior to Animals?'

Before answering the question, students had to rewind their minds back to the year 7 unit of work on the creation story. Here are the two Bible quotes at the focus of our learning, explained brilliantly by Niamh L in 8EHO:

God breathed
into his nostrils
the breath of life,
and the man
became a living
being.

This indicates that humans are superior as the way they are created was unique and special.

Only humans were made with God's breath, not animals.



This suggests that humans are superior as they share God's qualities meaning they are more similar to God than animals.

One of the biggest challenges that students face when studying philosophy for the first time, is that unlike subjects such as maths, science and languages, the questions they study have no definitive right or wrong answer. Instead, they have to develop their evaluative skills to reach their own justified viewpoint. This involves studying a range of different theories. Sometimes, students can find it difficult to remember which group of people a theory belongs to. To try to embed the theories into their long-term memory, we decided to invite an animal-aid speaker in so that students could experience a contrasting viewpoint to the ones previously studied in class. The student's superb essays and recent feedback demonstrate that this was a great success! A huge thank you to Keith Berry who came into every single year 8 class to deliver a powerful talk and a Q&A session on behalf of Animal Aid.



I really enjoyed listening to Keith talk about his views and ideologies and how passionate he is about this subject. I also like how he was honest when he said he'd take medicine knowing it'd been tested on animals rather than telling us to not take medicine because of this. (Eden F)



Many of the students initially found Keith's beliefs very convincing. However, at Penwortham Girls', we think it is crucial that students receive a balanced argument so that they have the freedom to make informed judgements. The next part of our journey focused on both the medical advancements, which would not have been possible without animal testing and the religious teaching of the "lesser of two evils". This linked the discussion back to where we started, with the philosophical question 'are humans superior to animals?'



When we are faced with a decision which requires us to choose between two difficult options, we refer to this as the Lesser of Two Evils....

SYNONYM: Lower / Minor

SYNONYM: Wicked / Harmful / Scary / Upsetting

"lesser of two evils"



Nobody wants to see animals or humans suffer. The government decided when creating the law on animal testing that even though it is upsetting to see the animals suffering, it is less upsetting than watching humans suffer as a result of untreatable diseases.

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The students thrived throughout the verbal debates and they were able to transfer these skills to the written assessment, "Animal Testing is Always Wrong" - Evaluate this statement." Here, you can see how they combined their knowledge from each of the sessions into a formal essay. Well done, Year 8!

Hang people may agree that animal testing is always wrong because they may believe that arrivals should have equal rights to humans. Evidence that supports this is the fact that the animal testing law is out dated, being made in the 1900s. The reason this would suggest animal testing is wrong is because science and technology thank has developed over the years and there are many other ways that you could test medicines and vaccines. & Some Christians may dissagree and think that an animals life is of less emportance than a humans. Evidence which supports this is the quote from the bible "God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breated into his nostrils the breath of life and man became a living soul. Key Stage 3 Computing

Year 7 students have been designing and creating their own game using Scratch. The game had to have a theme about healthy eating and had to educate others all about being healthy. They also had to include a variety of scripts, sprites and variables. Once completed, these games will then be evaluated and assessed. The games that have been planned are fantastic with a lot of imagination!

Year 8 students have been learning about internet-searching techniques. They have looked into a variety of research, including primary and secondary research, with the girls conducting their own primary research around the topic of aliens. They have started to produce some amazing information leaflets including persuasive vocabulary to inform audiences about whether aliens exist.

Year 9 students have been learning about advanced publisher skills. They have conducted some secondary research around magazines, looking at the designs of a variety of magazines and publications. They have reviewed these publications to generate ideas for their own magazine design. The girls carried out primary research into magazine designs and topics. They then analysed their findings and using this research, are starting to design their own professional-looking magazine. The girls have amazed me at the quality of the magazines created so far and I am looking forward to seeing the completed product. Later this half term, they are building on their python coding skills from year 8 and will be given taster sessions of GCSE Computer Science.

GCSE Computer Science

Year 11 have been learning about algorithms, designing simple computer programs and then creating these using python. They have upcoming mock exams and in preparation, need to be focusing on previous theory completed in year 10. The mock exams will enable the girls to concentrate on any weaker areas as part of their ongoing revision.

The year 10 students have had a fantastic first half term and have been learning the theory behind computers. They have started to understand how all the components work together. The girls have completed some assessments and there have been some incredible results. Keep up the hard work!




