Year 7s have the opportunity to attend our Year 7 German Spelling Bee competition which leads to a national competition. All students in all year groups have had the opportunity to attend German and French film club. This takes place on Wednesday lunchtimes with both a French film and a German film available for our learners and there is more information below about those clubs. This half term, there have been lots of exciting opportunities for our learners to use the laptops and computer rooms to further their language learning. Our students have been using the laptops in lessons to play Quizlet Live, Blooket and Kahoot to practise their vocabulary further. Highly competitive and great fun!

Blooket, Quizlet and Kahoot to further our language learning

This half term, we have been working on improving our vocabulary retention by practising and investigating different ways to learn our vocabulary each week. Pupils have had the opportunity to explore different apps and websites to further their vocabulary learning both in lessons and as homework. All pupils should now have a Quizlet account. Quizlet is a fantastic website/app to store vocabulary flashcards and play games to learn vocabulary and hopefully retain it. We have also been working on practising the vocabulary by using Blooket. This is a fun website that can be used in class or as a homework and our pupils have really enjoyed playing the café game, crypto hack, fishing frenzy, racing and the most popular game, 'Gold Chest', where they get to answer questions. Well done, girls on all the vocabulary games you have played recently!



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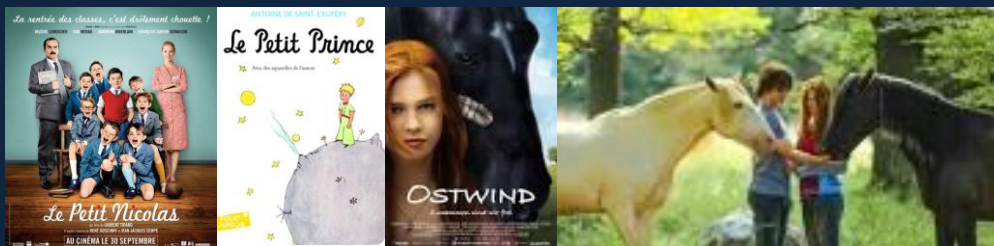

The French group have watched 'Le Petit Nicolas' and 'Le Petit Prince'. Both films are based on famous books. Did you know 'Le Petit Nicolas' is based on a series of French children's books written by René Goscinny and 'Le Petit Prince' has been translated into over 300 different languages? This puts it in the top 5 most translated books in the world! The German group have watched 'Ostwind' and 'Ostwind 2' and both have proved really popular as there are lots of twists and turns along the way. We are looking forward to watching a Christmas film over the coming weeks.



Spelling Bee – CGE

Our year 7 Germanists have been working hard, learning their first 50 words and their spellings for our inaugural German Spelling Bee. Organised by 'Routes into Languages', the Spelling Bee consists of four stages; an in-class competition in December, an inter-class competition in February, the Regional final in Manchester and the National final in May. Year 7 have covered the Spelling Bee in class and have been practising their vocabulary independently using Quizlet. There have been some impressive times in the Match game. Miss Gelder has seen some wonderful revision techniques and it looks as though lots of parents and siblings have been getting involved at home too!

In our club during Thursday lunch, we have been practising our vocabulary and then we have had some mini-spelling bees. We have been very impressed with the students' speed and the accuracy of their spelling. It's looking to be a very competitive competition and we are all looking forward to it!

We have lots more fun activities planned for rest of this half term. Our Revision Bunting competition is being launched soon and this will encourage our girls to look at different revision techniques when learning, retrieving and retaining new vocabulary. 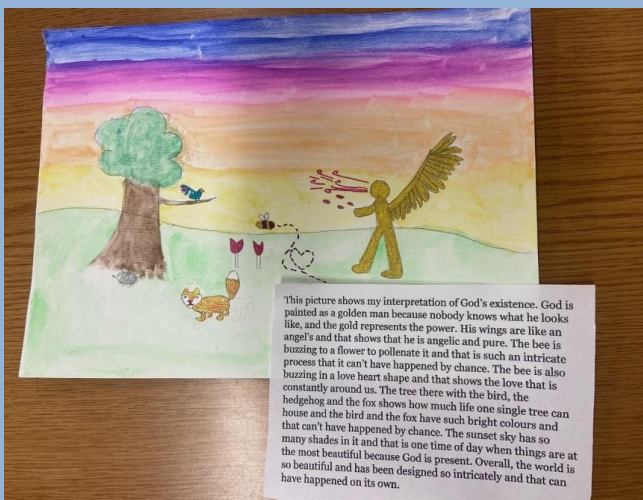
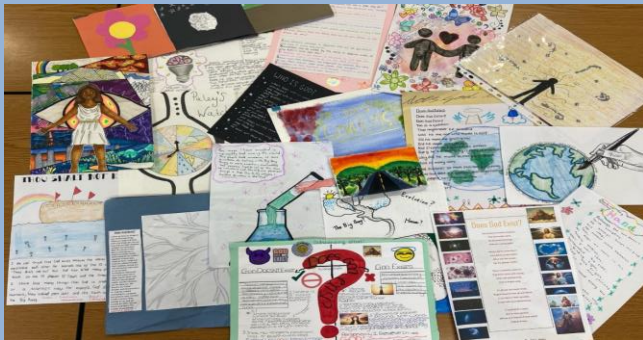

Spirited Arts Competition: YR 8 – Does God Exist?

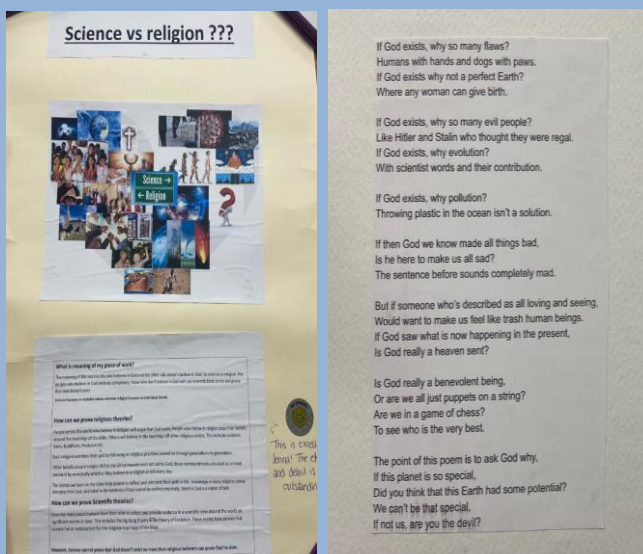

2nd - Eva M

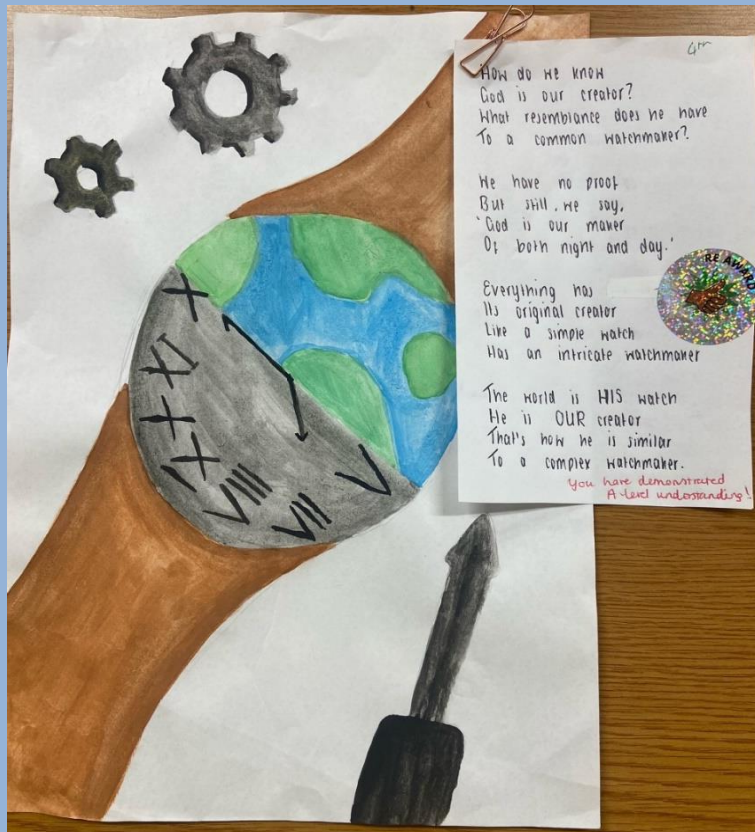

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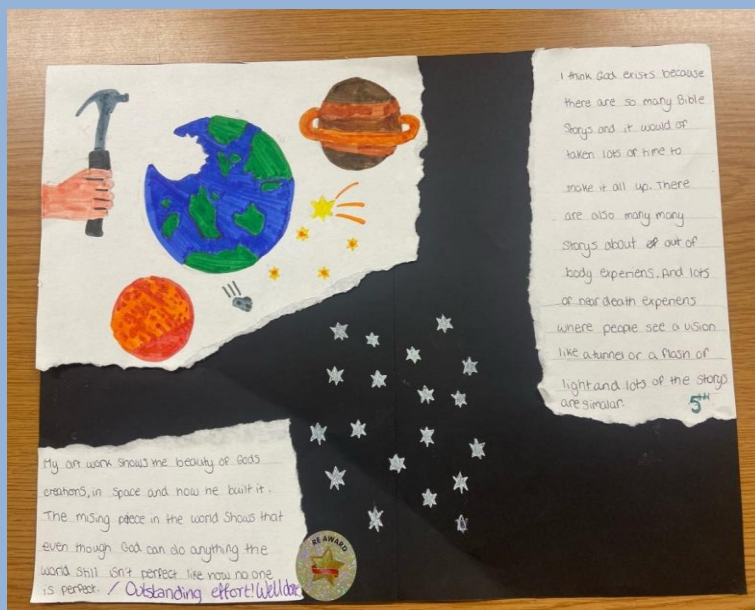


3rd - Jenna K

Olivia H: My christening bracelet is special to me because lots of different relatives bought me the charms for it, I don't wear it often as I'm so scared of losing it.

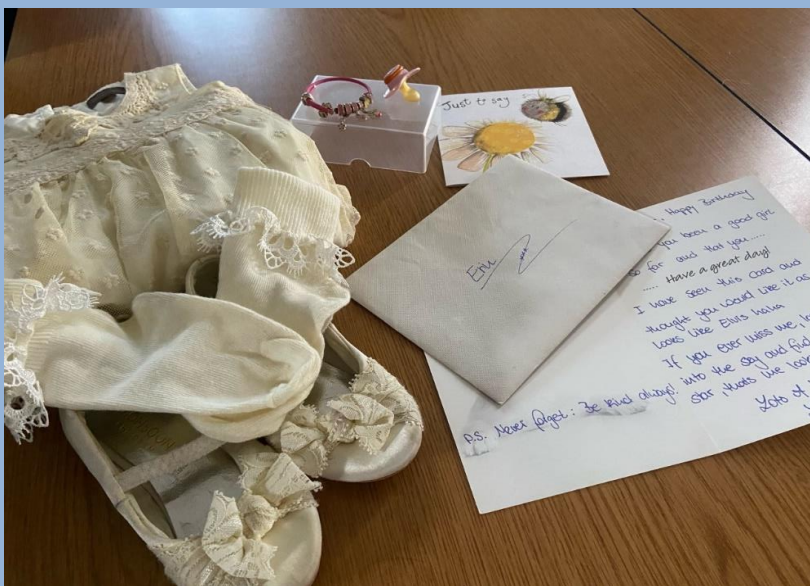

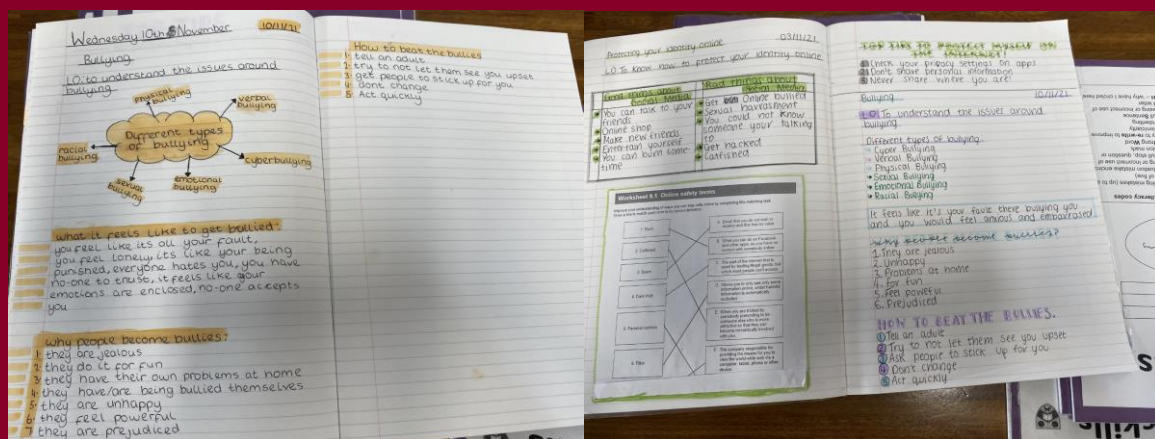
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KS3 Life Skills Lessons

Year 7 have done some reflective work on bullying and cyberbullying. This has included looking at reasons for bullying, how it makes others feel, ways to report and strategies to deal with bullying issues. They have been shown the Impero confide button as a source of reporting issues to staff in school.



Year 8 have spent several weeks looking at stereotyping, prejudice, discrimination, radicalisation and racism. Here are some of the student response to preventing radicalisation. Year 8 also looked at the school's equality policy and their own role within the PGHS and wider community.

Being careful about what you post online, who you talk to and the impressions that you make of yourself online to others who may see your posts and want to involve you in some sort of extreme beliefs.

Tell an adult if something suspicious pops up

To prevent people from radicalisation you can prevent people from being drawn into terrorism and ensure that they are given appropriate advice and support.

Not standing there and just recording it - speaking up / reporting it

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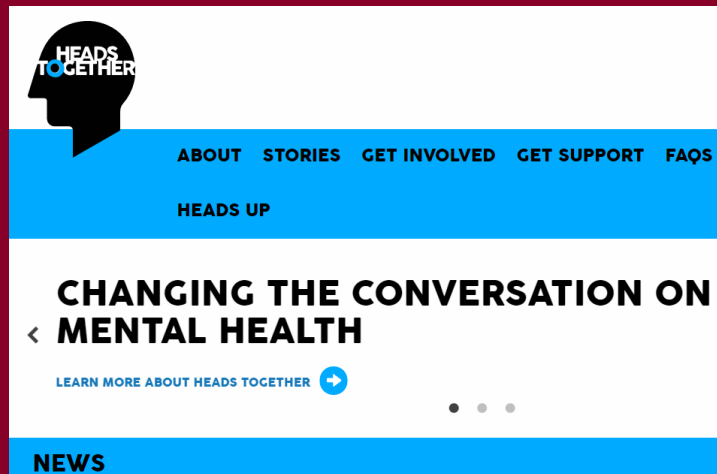

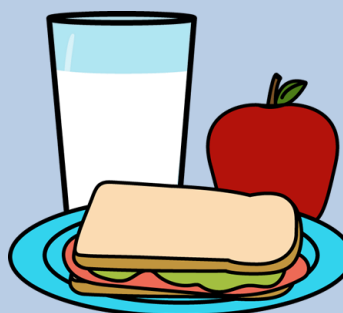

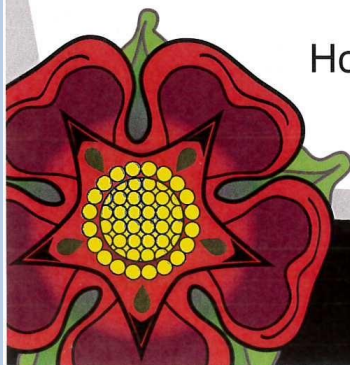
