SAFER INTERNET DAY

On Tuesday 8th February is **Safer Internet Day**. Each year there is a different theme for this. This year, the theme is 'All fun and games?'

As a school, we will be using this theme for all the assemblies to make every student aware of demonstrating respect and building positive relationships whilst online.

Students are increasingly online these days and are being exposed to a variety of new online tools. It is our responsibility to teach them how to stay safe and what is acceptable use on the software and Apps around today and how to show respect in a virtual environment.

DISCORD

This is a popular app for gamers that has come to the attention of the safeguarding team recently. Discord is the only cross-platform voice and text chat app designed specifically for gamers.

With the app users can stay connected to all Discord voice and text channels even when AFK (Away From Keyboard). Discord provides anonymity and privacy for communications, this does mean that it is vulnerable to the users who may use it for hostile or predatory behaviour and abuse whilst in chats.

It has an age restriction of 13+ but is being used by many children younger than this.

We have been informed that this app is becoming more popular with children can be used to send inappropriate sexual content and is linked to cybercrime.

Top Tips for Parents/ Carers

Having conversations without judgement.

Whether by playing games, watching videos, or doing things your child enjoys, spending time together online is a great way to start conversations about the online world and how they're finding being a part of it.

It is important to ask questions and take an interest in what your child enjoys online.

An essential part of having this open dialogue is to not judge, even if their behaviour or life online isn't what you wanted or expected. This ensures that your child feels they can come to you if ever they make a mistake or experience a problem online.

Knowing where you can learn more about their favourite apps and games.

Websites like Common Sense Media or The Family Gaming Database can be invaluable sources of information. When your child starts talking about a new game or app, why not do some research into the reporting and blocking options available? Then you can help your child if they come to you with an issue.

Reassuring your child that whatever happens online, you are there to support them.

Let your child know that the best way to address any problem they have online, is to tell a trusted adult immediately. For example, this might include someone sending them a friend request; an online message; telling them to visit a specific website or app, or asking them for their personal information. Reassure them that if anything happens online that they are unsure about, or makes them feel worried or upset, they can come to you for help.

Top Tips to Protect Your Child



BEWARY OF WHAT'S SHARED

Whatever your child says or shares on the platform can be seen, heard and shared with a much larger sudiance. Se careful to make sure your child understands this and does not say or share snything that could be deemed offensive, harmful or put themselves or others at risk.

2 IMPROVE SECURITY SETTINGS

To help protect your child, make sure they set strong passwords. You should consider using the 'twofactor authentication' function for earts protection. It's also important to remind your child to rever to share their personal information, or the details of another user.



3 CHECK THEIR FRIEND LIST

5 BE WARY OF NSFW CONTENT

Patter roums or patential venue for inappropriate content that you should be wary of. There is a Discord macrot known as Wampus; which is supposed to represent anyons under 18. Aryons who posts centent unsuitable for under-18s, should mark it NSFW (Net Suitable For Wampus).



5 SHOW RESPECT TO OTHERS

It's important you actively teach your child to treat other users with respect and behave online the same way as they would offline.

TURN ON SAFE MESSAGING

You should encourage your child to activate the Safe Direct Managing option. This will scan and delete any direct messages sent to your child containing explicit content.
