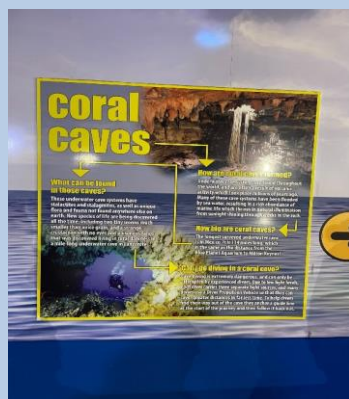
## Blue Planet Aquarium Year 7 Visit 2022

On the 28<sup>th</sup> February 2022, to celebrate our exciting new STEM fortnight, we invited all of Year 7 to join us at the Blue Planet Aquarium. This educational experience included classroom workshops, diver talks and the opportunity to view a range of marine forms in preparation for our Art & Design Unit 2 Sculpture Project.

Throughout the day, students were fully engaged with a wide range of activities, looking at textures and learning about the biodiversity in our precious coral reefs. Environmental issues were also discussed and we explored ways of protecting our marine habitats.

It is aimed that over the following months, Year 7 will use this visit as a useful reference source for observational drawing and textural clay sculptures. We look forward to sharing examples of our student's work later this academic year.

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## Fine Art Workshop at Newman College – Year 10

This term, we also took a group of Year 10s to visit the Fine Art workshop at Newman College. The session aimed to explore the use of printmaking within a 'Natural Forms' theme. Under instruction from subject specialist Andrea Chaunce, our students worked carefully to scratch into pre-prepared acetate blocks. These printing plates were later applied with a thin layer of ink and printed onto paper using the printing press.

We took students from a variety of CAT Faculty subjects. The students thoroughly enjoyed the experience of touring the College, viewing the Atrium Exhibition, exploring the Photography Studios and being able to experiment with a new technical process for their portfolio work.

Below are some of the examples created during this fantastic FE experience. Well done to everyone who took part and many thanks to Newman College for accommodating us.





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## Textiles Workshop at Newman College – Year 10

We had a very successful afternoon at Newman College this term. This included a number of students from across the CAT Faculty groups from GCSE Art & Design, Textiles and Photography.

We were very lucky to receive a guided tour of the Art studios and the Atrium Exhibition area, where there were some amazing artworks produced by the Art Foundation students. Our students were able to ask questions and enjoyed looking around the exhibition. It was a great opportunity for our students to see what the options are for them within Art & Design and Textiles Post-16. An insight into college life was also very interesting and may help influence our student's Post-16 choices.

Our workshop consisted of a whole afternoon in one of the specialist Textiles rooms, led by an experienced A-Level teacher. The specific nature of the workshop was experimentation of dysperse dyes used in conjunction with other design techniques. Our students were given the theme of 'Natural Forms' and were presented with their own pack of resources prepared by the college.



They were taught how to adapt photographs of Natural Forms into abstract patterns on fabric using the dysperse dye technique. Once students had their design transferred onto the fabric, they were then shown a variety of techniques to hand-embellish the designs with stitch and beading.

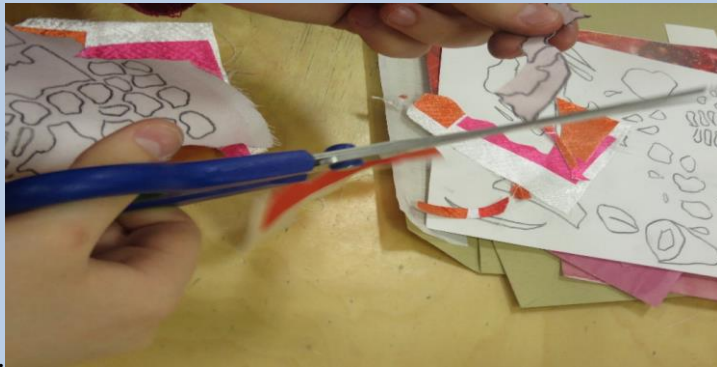

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## Key Stage 3 Computing

All Key Stage 3 students have been learning about the different aspects of online safety, which links to 'Internet Safer Day' which was on the 8<sup>th</sup> February 2022. The students learnt about what is acceptable and unacceptable behaviour when playing games online and also how to be respectful towards others when playing online games.

Students are increasingly online due to the current climate and are being exposed to a variety of new online tools. It is our responsibility to teach them how to stay safe and what is acceptable use on the software and apps around today. During these sessions, they will gain knowledge about a variety of apps and how to stay safe when using them.

As part of the STEM Festival, Key Stage 3 are taking part in a competition about 'Digital Footprint'. The students have been asked to design a poster to inform other students around school about the digital footprint and the consequences of posting and sharing items online. The posters will be judged and the winning posters from year 7, 8 and 9 will be printed professionally and displayed around school. 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## Brilliant Behaviour

*One of the most important ways that students learn is by responding to feedback to their teachers. When an identified piece of work has been marked, teachers will routinely set an improvement task for them to complete. These are known as MRI tasks (My Reponse Is) and when teachers can see that students have reacted positively and enthusiastically to that feedback, they can award them an MRI Reactor point on Class Charts. Students write their responses in green pen, or they may be asked to complete a follow up activity in a practical subject or creative subject, that shows they understand what they needed to do to improve.*

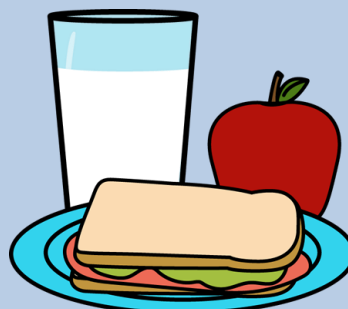
